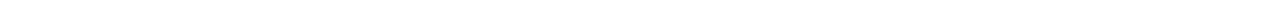

Welcome to the *2004-2005 Project Bank: Encyclopedia of Public Health and Community Projects*. Since 1974, *Project Bank* has become the single most comprehensive tool the American Medical Association Alliance offers to assist fellow state and county Alliances in planning and implementing projects and programs.

Project Bank contains more than 500 projects that have been conducted by state and county Alliances throughout the country from 2000 to 2004. (A listing of all projects from 1996 to 1999 is included as Appendix I.) Detailed information on all projects is available to you simply by ordering a copy of the project file from AMA Alliance Headquarters via the Project Request Form (Appendix III).

Section I, "Project Planning," contains information to assist you in successfully launching your project.

Section II, "Awards Information," highlights this year's Health Awareness Promotion Award Winners and provides the form and instructions for next year's award entries. Instructions and entry form for the **new Legislative Education and Awareness Promotion (LEAP) Awards** are also in this section.

Section III, "2000-2004 Project Listing," is divided into categories and sub-categories for easy reference. The projects are listed in order beginning with the most recent, and HAP Award entries and winners are indicated by symbols (see legend at the bottom of Project Listing pages).

Section IV, "Appendices," contains a listing of 1996-1999 projects, the Project Bank Submission Form, and the Project Request Form, used to receive information on specific projects. In addition, the Appendices include a History of HAP Award Winners and an Alliance Projects Reference List to assist Alliances in locating their specific projects in Section III.

Section I — Project Planning

Guidelines for Successful Project Planning

Selecting a Project

You have taken the first step toward choosing, planning, and implementing a successful project by reading *Project Bank*, which features more than 500 different projects in 22 different areas. Before deciding on a course of action, here are a few things you'll want to consider:

- Assess community needs. Because your time and resources—and those of your fellow Alliance members—are extremely valuable, your next step in planning a health education program or action project is to determine what issues need to be addressed. Besides considering your community needs, you will also want to consider what other groups are doing, and how you can fill in gaps between the needs and the services that exist in your community.
- Determine a comfortable level of involvement. Not every effort has to be a multi-phased program. Sometimes even the smallest amount of funds, expertise, or resources can have a large impact.
- Research surrounding issues. Choose an issue and brainstorm about who it affects and how. This will help you isolate related issues needing attention that often get overlooked.
- Consider one person's experience. You may be able to help an individual coping with AIDS, cancer, or another debilitating disease by providing a service that will make his or her experience a little easier.
- Target your audience. For projects geared toward awareness or education, think about your audience and how you'll reach them most effectively, whether through your local media or via information posted in public places, physicians' offices, the hospital, or local schools.

Doing Educational Programs

Planning educational programs accomplishes two goals at once—they are a great way to improve people's awareness of health issues, and they also

increase the Alliance's exposure in the community. Here are some planning tips:

- Choose an interesting or timely topic.
- Contact your medical society.
- Appoint your planning committee.
- Choose a date and time.
- Plan your location.
- Arrange your speakers.
- Set a registration fee.
- Invite participants.
- Contact the media.
- Consider physical arrangements.

Designing Action Projects

Whether you are planning health screenings for the homeless or delivering food to the aged, the following steps will help you make certain your projects are effective in reaching your goals:

- Select a project.
- Contact your medical society.
- Appoint a committee.
- Identify your resources and needs.
- Establish goals.
- Plan a course of action.
- Evaluate the costs involved.
- Gather materials.
- Organize and train your volunteers.
- Publicize the project.

Working with Schools

Alliance programs can go a long way toward meeting the health education needs of pre-school, elementary, middle, and high school students. When you plan to work with a local school, there are a few things you will need to research first. Some things to inquire about include:

- State policy on health education
- Local policy on health education
- Support from school administration
- Support from teachers
- Any possible hindrances
- Influence by groups such as PTA, teachers' union, and other key organizations

Once you have considered these issues and developed a proposed plan of action, your committee should meet with the school administrators, and possibly teachers, to present your plans. Use this meeting as an opportunity to find out who is in charge of curriculum development and teacher training. As you formulate your program, be sure to involve all the key players, including the policy makers, school administrators, teachers, parent leaders, school health professionals, the local health department, volunteer organizations, and the local media. The most effective school-based programs are those that are supported by, and which interact with, the community.

Publicizing Your Efforts

In the world of community service, some view publicity as self-serving, see it as unnecessary, or feel that it is merely the icing on the cake of a good program. It is important, however, that publicity not be an afterthought. It should be treated as a critical component of your program, deserving of as much effort as fund-raising, planning, and volunteering. Simply put, your promotional efforts to attract the media translate into wider community awareness. And more exposure to members of your community is the key to a positive image, a bigger membership, and stronger funding potential. Here are some simple steps:

- Identify your news and plan around it. If your gala raises \$5,000 to buy computer equipment for a

local school, remember which is the real news. Set up a day at the school and invite the media to cover the children using their new computers.

- Make media contacts.
- Write and send a news release, fact sheet, or pitch letter.
- Craft a Public Service Announcement by writing a 30- or 60-second "ad" for your local radio and television stations.
- Confirm that your media contacts received the information you sent. If they didn't, send it again, fax it to them, or tell them about your project when you have them on the phone. Be sure to be sensitive to their deadlines—ask about them.

Working with the Medical Society

Sometimes, the medical society is unaware of what an asset the Alliance can be. Be sure you communicate with both the members and the staff as often as possible about the projects you are doing. Here are some ways to do that:

- Report activities at meetings. Again, make every attempt to focus on the results of your efforts.
- Plan joint projects and programs. Medical professionals, a network of committed volunteers, and medical society staff form a powerful combination for developing successful programs.

Establishing Coalitions

If you are interested in targeting a specific health issue in your community but do not have the resources to tackle it alone, consider forming a coalition. By working with other organizations, you will have access to a greater amount of the volunteers, funds, resources, and enthusiasm needed to make a strong impact in your community. Depending on the size of the project you want to undertake, you may decide to team up with one or a small number of organizations in your community, or you may want to develop a statewide or regional network of support. Whatever your goals for forming a coalition, the necessary elements are the same—time, planning, and, of course, teamwork.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Health Careers Pathway Program

Hall County Medical Association Alliance, Nebraska

Initiated due to community-wide shortages of health care professionals, the Health Careers Pathway program was designed to promote health careers at the high school level and provide hands-on training and mentorship opportunities to students.

The courses offered in the program include Clinical Nutrition, Sports Medicine, Medical Terminology, Introduction to Health Careers, Introduction to Dental Careers, Mentorship and a Certified Nursing Assistant class. All of the courses are taught by high school or college instructors who were trained by health care professionals and are recognized by a local college for credit.

During the 2004-2005 school year, 400 students were enrolled in the program.

Take it to the Limits Gala 2005

Travis County Medical Alliance, Texas

In order to provide a unique social event that would raise money and bring together the medical community in a fun atmosphere, Alliance members created a fund-raising gala that was different from past events by securing a television station as the event venue and hiring a well-known entertainer, Kelly Willis.

The event, which sold out to 300 guests and raised more than \$30,000, also included a silent auction and raffle, featuring autographed items from Lance Armstrong and Sheryl Crow.

SAVE AND “SAVE TODAY”

I Can Handle Bullies

Nashville Academy of Medicine Alliance, Tennessee

To address the issue of bullying, Alliance members collaborated with the Medical Society to bring in the Imagination Theater from Chicago to perform “Ease the Tease” to two inner city schools. Members also distributed 2,500 “I Can Handle Bullies” activity books to 82 metropolitan elementary schools.

School art teachers also held a poster contest related to the book. One poster won from each of the four grades participating city-wide. Winning schools were awarded \$250 and winning children received backpacks full of prizes.

In addition, Alliance members distributed “Talk to your Kids about Bullying” bookmarks, and then created their own with relevant county information.

2006 Health Awareness Promotion Awards

Entry Guidelines and Form

IMPORTANT! Please note the following **requirements for qualification and changes in award categories**. Any HAP Award entries that are not in compliance will automatically be disqualified.

- The HAP Award entry must be postmarked no later than **March 1, 2006**.
- All entries, unless submitted online, must contain the **official** entry form found on page 9.
- The identity of the county must **NOT** be included anywhere within the entry itself, only on the cover page. This is to insure impartiality.
- The complete description must **NOT** exceed four (4) pages.
- The entry must **NOT** include collateral materials (brochures, fliers, posters, etc.).
- Eight (8) copies of the entry must be included, unless submitted online.
- An electronic version (diskette or email) must be sent, unless submitted online.

Recognizing Excellence

The Health Awareness Promotion (HAP) Awards were initiated in 1989 by the AMA Alliance to recognize excellence in the health promotion programs and projects of **COUNTY and RPS/MSS** Alliances throughout the nation. All **COUNTY and RPS/MSS** Alliances are encouraged to enter one program or project per category. However, the same project may **NOT** be submitted in more than one category. All submissions will be included in *Project Bank: The Encyclopedia of Public Health and Community Projects*.

project must have been initiated by or have had major involvement of the County Alliance or RPS/MSS group. A project that has won a HAP Award cannot be resubmitted within three years of the win unless the project has been changed in some capacity or a new component has been added. Alliances can not win a HAP Award in the same category two years in a row.

HAP Award Honors

The HAP Awards are presented at the AMA Alliance Annual Meeting in June in Chicago. The AMA Alliance invites a representative from each winning county to make a short presentation and then honors the county during the opening ceremony of the House of Delegates. Although the county chooses the person to accept the award, that person **MUST BE** a current AMA Alliance member.

Entry Deadline

All entries must be postmarked by **MARCH 1, 2006**. A confirmation letter will be mailed to confirm that the AMA Alliance has received your entry. Winners will be notified in April.

Eligibility

Only **COUNTY and RPS/MSS** Alliances are eligible for award consideration. Eligible projects must have been held and completed between March 1, 2005 and February 28, 2006. If the project was conducted in coalition with another group(s), the

Judging Process

The HAP Awards Judging Committee is composed of five members including the secretary, health promotion chair, immediate past president, and two directors. The entries are judged based on the written project summary that is submitted. The summary should contain the following: description of goals, impact on community or target audience, impact on the Alliance, and budget and donation summary. The judging criteria will include the following: uniqueness, creativity, originality, innovative use of materials, and impact on the community and Alliance. Decisions are based **ONLY** on the project description; please do not refer to attachments (press releases, news features, posters, etc.) in your description. All attachments will be placed in a *Project Bank* file. To maintain fairness, all entries are blinded and coded; please do not refer to

your Alliance in the project description by name, county, city, or state.

HAP Award Categories

Each county or RPS/MSS group may submit only **ONE** program or project per category. However, the same project may **NOT** be submitted in more than one category.

Community Service/SAVE

Two projects will be awarded in this category: one Community Service and one SAVE. Community Service projects provide a health-related service in the community, and/or educate and bring awareness to a certain population on a particular topic (health screenings, in-school programs, health fairs, forums, workshops, public relations, etc.). SAVE/SAVE Today projects support the nation SAVE (Stop America's Violence Everywhere) program (SAVE vigils, shelter programs, Hands Are Not For Hitting, etc.).

Fund-raising

Two projects will be awarded in this category. Projects will **NOT** be judged on the amount of money raised. Instead, projects should reflect efforts to plan and implement the fund-raiser (dances, dinners, races, grant programs, benefits, etc.).

Project Description

Please provide the information listed below. Limit descriptions to **one page (350 online) per section**—bullet points may be used. Please type and double-space each page. Use the completed Entry Form as your cover page. Judges will refer only to your project description when reviewing your entry. Please do not refer to attachments or the name of your Alliance in the project description.

Remember, as a HAP Award entry, your project description is automatically included in *Project Bank*.

There will be one award given to a county Alliance and one award given to a state Alliance. All submissions will be included in *Project Bank: The Encyclopedia of Public Health and Community Projects*.

LEAP Award Honors

The LEAP Awards are presented at the AMA Alliance Annual Meeting in June in Chicago. The AMA Alliance and AMPAC invite one person from each winning county and state to make a short presentation at the Focus Session and then honor the county and state during the Prestige Awards Gala Dinner. Although the county and state choose the person to accept the award, that person **MUST BE** a current AMA Alliance and AMPAC member.

Eligibility

Both **COUNTY and STATE** Alliances are eligible for award consideration. Eligible projects must have been held between February 10, 2005 and March 15, 2006 and scheduled to be completed by April 2006.

Entry Deadline

All entries must be postmarked by **MARCH 15, 2006**. A confirmation letter will be mailed to confirm that the AMA Alliance has received your entry. Winners will be notified in April.

Judging Process

The LEAP Awards Judging Committee is composed of six members including the AMA Alliance legislation chair (chair of LEAP committee), immediate past president, one board member and three AMPAC board members (one to be an Alliance representative). The entries are judged based on the project summary, description of goals, impact of project on the target audience, impact on legislative and political involvement, impact on AMPAC and state PAC membership and budget and resource summary. Decisions are based **ONLY** on the project description; please do not refer to attachments (press releases, news features, posters, etc.) in your description. All attachments will be placed in a *Project Bank* file. To maintain fairness, all entries are blinded and coded; please do not refer to your Alliance in the project description by name, county, city, or state.
